LANDAU FORTE ACADEMY AMINGTON OPENED IN 2010

Whilst the Academy is part of the national network of schools and academies, it is owned and operated as an independent educational organisation providing free full time education for children from 11 to 16 years old.

The Academy has been established to bring together the worlds of business, industry and education in a uniquely productive partnership to secure the highest quality education for young people. The Academy moved to new purpose built accommodation in September 2011 which provides a first class learning environment for 960 11 – 16 year olds at Amington and 860 16 – 19 year olds at Tamworth Sixth Form Academy.

The Academy intends to provide a distinctive style of education. The aim is to make learning challenging, interesting and relevant to the future to ensure that our students:

- Have acquired the ability to think logically and approach situations with an open and inquiring mind.
- Become independent learners.
- Have discovered and developed their personal strengths, aptitudes and interests.
- Are familiar with the expectations of future employers.
- Understand how business and industry is structured and operates.
- Are well equipped with the technological skills, adaptability and interpersonal skills necessary in employment and training.
- Have developed personal qualities of initiative, self-reliance and responsibility so that they grow into enterprising, versatile and law abiding citizens.
- Are encouraged to contribute to a better society which takes into account the needs of others and shows respect for people and the environment.

THE CURRICULUM

We view the Curriculum as the sum total of all the learning experiences within the Academy..

...not simply the identifiable subjects.

Consequently, the learning programmes extend beyond the requirements of the National Curriculum and subject boundaries, intending to fully develop our young people so that they may successfully contribute to a modern and increasingly global society.

There is a clear focus on the core subjects of Mathematics, Science, English and ICT with a strong emphasis on Technology (including Art and Design), Business and Foreign Languages. The educational experience is further enhanced through Humanities, Performing Arts, and Physical Education & Sport along with other Cultural, Enterprise and Personal Challenge activities. In addition to examination qualifications, students are able to gain accredited awards through national schemes across a wide range of activities.

During their early years at the Academy, students follow programmes of learning which build upon their previous knowledge from primary school. New and exciting subjects not previously studied at primary school are also introduced. Students build upon their experiences from the early years at the Academy studying for GCSE and vocational qualifications during Key Stage 4 (13/14 – 16 age range).

Throughout the Curriculum, all students take part in work related learning and placement activities. As a result, all students have a broad foundation which over time is increasingly personalised to fully release their potential and to meet the ambition and aspirations of the individual.









DISTINCTIVE FEATURES OF OUR ASPECT TO LEARNING

It is important that our students learn how to learn as well as learning what to learn! A number of distinctive features are designed to promote and support effective learning, attainment and achievement.

- Building good learning habits through creative and active approaches to learning.
- An enterprise culture with strong emphasis on the importance of each subject to the world of industry and commerce.
- The study of at least one foreign language.
- Flexible use of a wide range of learning resources.
- Flexible student grouping.
- Off-site learning including day and residential educational visits and field work undertaken locally, nationally and internationally.
- Appropriate use of Information and Communication Technology to promote effective teaching and learning.
 Development of individual
- education programmes to meet individual student needs.
- Personal Tutorial support for each student within vertically aged Personal Tutorial groups.
- A comprehensive extension and enrichment activities programme.
- A continuous extended learning day.
- Staff development and training days held in student holidays.

Being a student at Landau Forte Academy Amington is a key part of a learning journey which critically bridges the period between the world of primary school through the adolescent years to the world of higher education and employment.

Students have the opportunity to go on to complete further education at our Tamworth Sixth Form Academy.
