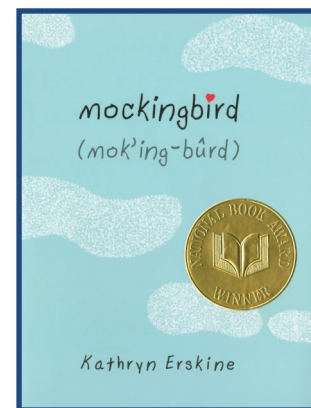
## Paris
