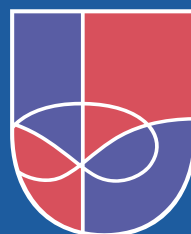

At Landau Forte Academy this year, we have been working with our students on the habits we believe make for effective, life-long learners. If you read through the many articles in this term's packed edition, several of these habits come to mind. Students have planned and collaborated in their personal tutor groups to make articles or create games for our very successful Christmas Extravaganza. We have had tremendous sporting success this year, all of which takes perseverance. We have exposed the students to new experiences, such as 'Animals In Hands' and the visit to the Harry Potter studios. This clearly links with noticing, questioning and making links as well and hopefully ignites a sense of awe and wonder in the students. 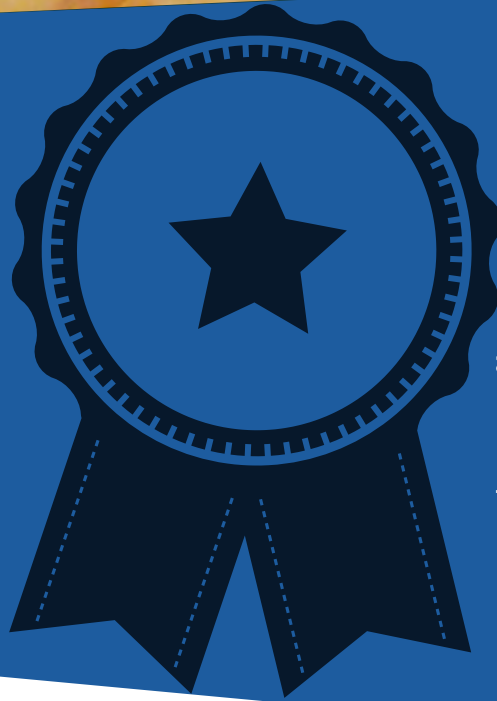

Nineteen students gave up a day of their holidays to be the first group of students in Tamworth to complete the new FA's Junior Football Leaders Award Training.

They spent the day looking at a range of areas including: organising and managing a football activity session, an introduction to refereeing and helping with a team. The course had both practical and theory components.

All candidates were successful and now just need to complete four hours work experience.

Sportivate Girls Fitness Sessions

A successful bid for funding from 'Sportivate' was granted for an all girls fitness group.

Year 10 and 11 girls are enjoying an introduction to a fun and informative programme of activities related to personal fitness/self defence. A combination of fitness training and supported practice were introduced using exercises such as boxercise, gym work, body conditioning, and techniques based on Aikido/Tae kwon-do.

It is hoped that the variety of activities that are offered throughout the course will

ensure that the girls can continue with these forms of exercise as they develop into adult life. Tamworth has many gyms/fitness classes that are available to access on either a 'pay as you go' system, or as a membership.

On successful completion of the six week course there will be a special concession for the girls to attend South Staffs College, Tamworth's exercise classes, and in addition to this, there will be two months free for the girls after a paid induction at the 'pay as you go' Landau Forte Academy Amington's Fitness Suite.

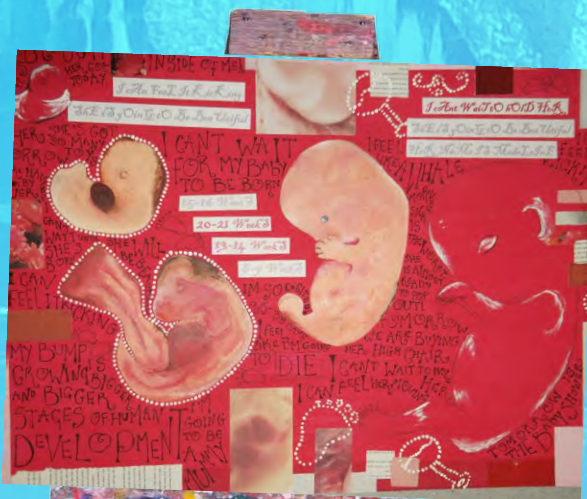

VISIT TO LONDON

On Monday 17th December, 48 students from Year 7 to Year 10 were taken to London for the day. The main part of this trip was to visit the Houses of Parliament. The students were taken on a guided tour and were lucky enough to go into the House of Lords and the House of Commons. Students then participated in a voting workshop. The students made their own manifestos for an interactive election and explored the world of different voting systems and voting behaviour. This included the first past the post and proportional representation electoral systems.

The journey down to the Houses of Parliament took in the sights of Buckingham Palace, where the students were very lucky to see the Changing of the Guard from their coach window. The students also went on the London Eye and a cruise along the Thames to take in the sights of the capital city. The students were absolutely excellent and really enjoyed their day, especially joining in with a sing-song on the coach on the way back to the Academy.

The trip will run again in 2013-2014, so students will need to look out for the advert. The price of the trip was approximately £20, including entrance to the London Eye, the Thames Cruise and travel.

‘Animals In Hands’ are a company that take live animals along with a speaker to schools in the UK. At the end of 2012, they visited Landau Forte Academy Amington. In groups, we had a twenty minute presentation about natural life. During the speech, we learned about habitats, awakenings and lots of different kinds of animals. Also, we got to meet some creatures for the full experience!

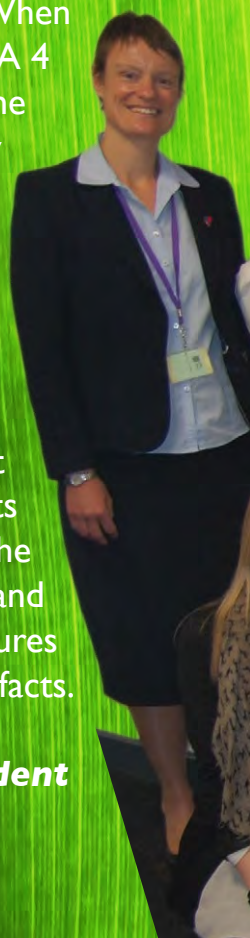
The first creature that came out was a tarantula. It was quite small, as it was only a young spider, but lots of the girls were scared. The man told us about how spiders live and adapt in the wild. We also got the chance to hold the tarantula. It was very lively and kept trying to crawl out of my hands.

The next animal we saw was a large jumping frog. This animal didn’t want to be out of his box; it was obvious. The speaker told us about that species of frog and once again let people hold the animal. But whenever someone picked him up, he jumped on the floor.

Finally, we had two snakes. First, there was a small red and black snake. The speaker also had a box of the skin that the snake had shed. When he was put away, the big boy came out. A 4 metre boa constrictor! I found out during the presentation that constrictors can eat prey up to the size of a pig and then not eat for a year. It took 5 at a time to hold the large snake.

In conclusion, I think ‘Animals In Hands’ was really good because you learnt lots of new facts and the live animals made it interactive. We also used learning habits including; listening to the speaker, noticing the creatures, questioning about the animals and making links between the live creatures and the facts.

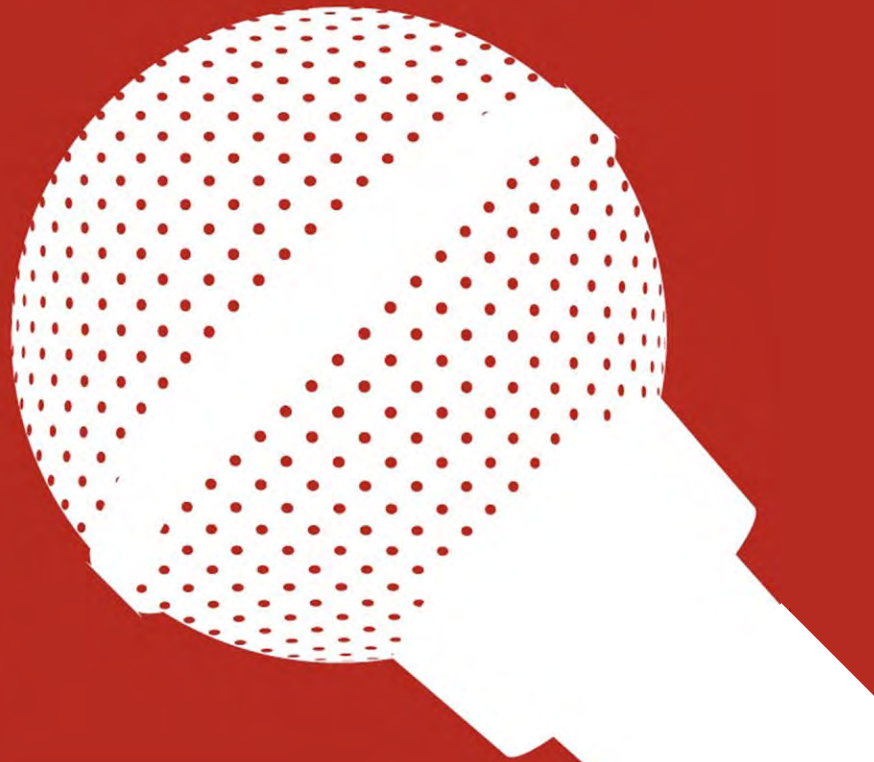
The show provided an unrivalled skills experience in displaying the wide range of vocational careers on offer in the UK, from media to publishing, to retail to healthcare.

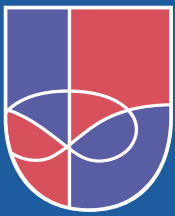
