Nature of the support 2013-14

The funding for the Pupil Premium has been allocated in the following ways:

- Summer school programme to support the transition of students from Primary to Secondary involving literacy, numeracy and social skills
- A programme of enrichment activities offered after Academy hours
- To partially fund a one week enrichment programme
- To provide an alternative curriculum for some more of our vulnerable students
- To purchase and use an Accelerated Reader programme
- Training of middle leaders to improve teaching and learning
- Teaching and Learning training of all day and cover to provide attendance to training programme at Landau Forte College Derby
- Training of staff to embed the learning habits to improve learning skills of the students
- Employment of Behaviour Support Managers
- Employment of Learning Support Assistants
- To fund a breakfast club
- To fund the Lexia programme to help identify students with dyslexic tendencies and provide small group work support at tutor time

Curriculum focus of PPG spending

- To provide staff training and coaching to ensure all learning sessions experienced by all students is at least good

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

- This has been through data analysis of attendance, expected levels of progress in core subjects, reading and spelling ages, further attainment and attendance to enrichment programmes
