MIDDLETON LAKES

Y7 Geographers embarked on an expedition to study river environments at Middleton Lakes on 15 May. With wellies at the ready, students studied pollution in the stream by identifying creatures living on the stream bed.


Students had great fun catching and identifying different species including; stonefly, beetles, shrimp and even a fish were discovered lurking beneath the surface. The second activity of the day involved taking stream measurements. Using specialist equipment, students collected a variety of information about the depth of the stream and how fast it was flowing. A challenge was set to see who could find the deepest part and fastest part of the stream without getting wet.

After lunch, our afternoon was spent taking a leisurely stroll through Middleton Lakes in search of the River Tame. On our way, we saw a variety of wildlife including butterflies, herons and even a woodpecker! After a short walk we found our final study site. The students then emptied buckets of water over drainage tables to discover which surface water would flow over the quickest.

After a fun day out, we finally had time to relax!

BIRMINGHAM UNIVERSITY

Y10 students had a gathering regarding university life on 10 March. On 28 March, sixty-one Y10 students had an all-day visit at the university. The day began with a visit to the Biosciences building, where students received a presentation about the university. They then took part in a quiz to find out the real facts about degrees and the financial cost of studying. They found it surprising to discover that they would not start paying off any Government loan until they were earning at least £21,000 and then it would only be £30 a month, (as well as learning that there are degrees in Golf Management and Leather Technology!)

The students were taken in small groups for a tour around the university. They visited University House;

(the main eating area of the campus), as well as visiting the Munrow Sports Centre, the famous Aston Webb building which houses the Great Hall and over to the ARC; the student union. They also saw what a typical halls of residence bedroom looked like, and were treated to a free lunch.

The students then returned to Biosciences where they received a talk about university life by a first year student who used to go to Woodhouse School. Following this was a Q&A session where the students asked very studious questions about university. It was clear to them that performing well in their GCSEs had an effect on their chance of getting into university.

BETH SHALOM

In March, fifty five Y9 students visited Beth Shalom; the UK's only purpose-built Holocaust Memorial Centre. On arrival, students had an introductory talk about the history and purpose of the centre. They had the opportunity to look around the exhibition and learn about the rise of the Nazis and anti-Semitism, life during the Holocaust and the concentration camps. In the memorial gardens, everyone was invited to add a stone to a special pile to remember the 1.5 million children who were murdered in the Holocaust.

The highlight of the visit was the survivor talk from Trude Silman. Trude was part of the Kindertransport, having to leave her family in Europe. She talked about how the majority of her family were killed in concentration camps and how she tried to find out what had happened to her parents. Trude answered questions from students to help them understand her experiences in more detail.

ETHAN BILLINGE



At Ethan's swimming presentation in January, he gained first place in the 11 year old boys category; winning three gold medals in butterfly, backstroke and individual medley (25m butterfly, 25m backstroke, 25m breaststroke and 25m freestyle in one race) and two silver medals in breaststroke and freestyle. This is the third year running that he has achieved **first place**. He also broke seventeen club records in a variety of distances and disciplines. Ethan currently holds seven club records: 100m/200m backstroke, 200m, 400m and 1500m freestyle, and 100m/200m IM. He is the only swimmer in his club to swim the 1500m (60 lengths) in a race in 2013.

Finally he was awarded a special award by the Head Coach for Lichfield Swimming Club as 'Most Improved Boy' over the past twelve months. He swims six times a week, along with galas and 'open meets' at the weekends.

Staffordshire Championships

Ethan attended the Staffordshire Championships over the weekends of March 1/2 and March 15-16. These championships see swimmers from all over Staffordshire competing. He qualified for thirteen out of seventeen events, the most within his club of Lichfield.

- 50m, 100m and 200m backstroke
- 50m butterfly and breaststroke
- 50m, 100m, 200m, 400m and 1500m freestyle
- 100m, 200m and 400m IM

He achieved personal bests in all events except 50m backstroke, and broke club records in 1500m, 200m, 400m IM, 400m and 200m backstroke. He participated in the City of Birmingham Open Meet from 18-21 April. **He competed in eight events which were:**

1500m Freestyle: Achieved a gold medal, pb and club record of 19:29.59

400m Freestyle: Achieved a pb and club record of 5:01.73, narrowly missing the Midlands qualifying time of 5:01.70.

100m Backstroke: Achieved a Midlands qualifying time, gold medal, pb and club record 1:14.03.

200m IM: Achieved a pb and club record 2:49.96.

200m Backstroke: Achieved a Midlands qualifying time, gold medal, pb and club record 2:37.43.

100m Freestyle: Achieved a pb and club record 1:07.82.

200m Freestyle: Achieved a Midlands qualifying time, pb and club record 2:23.48.

50m Freestyle: Achieved a pb.

Ethan is the first swimmer in his club this year to achieve Midlands qualifying times.

MATHS CHALLENGE

On 1 May, 7MA1, 7MA2, 8MA1 and 8MA2 participated in the Junior Mathematics Challenge, organised by the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust.

The top 40% of students nationally receive a gold, silver or bronze certificate in the ratio 1:2:3 and each institution receives a 'Best in School' certificate.



Students at Landau Forte Academy Amington achieved one gold, eight silver and fourteen bronze certificates. Over 240,000 pupils from across the UK sat the Junior Maths Challenge, with roughly the top 6% receiving a gold certificate, 13% silver and 21% bronze. Our highest achievers include; Alex Brazington, Josh Jones, Edward Chipman, Bethan Durham, Ryan Stirk, Louise Sadler, Charlie Pointon, Daniel Robins and Callum Barrett. Congratulations to those that took part and we are looking forward to taking part again next year.

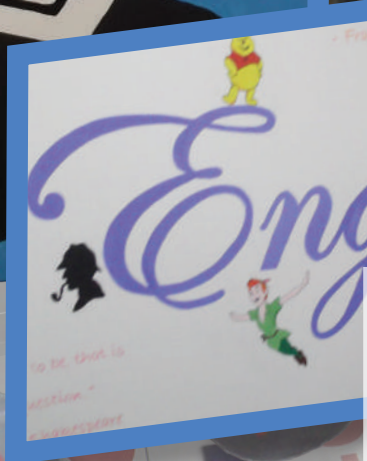
MURALS
