YEAR 11

Examination Paper 1
World Religions: Christianity and Islam Students will take a 1 hour 45 minute examination with questions about beliefs and practices from two major world faiths.

Continuous Online Revision Support Revision will be supported by department staff through live Q&A and online resources leading up to the exams.

Mock Examination 3 A final opportunity for students to test their skills with a full examination paper before the assessed examination.

Religion and Life This unit covers philosophical and ethical questions about the origins and value of the universe and human life.

Examination Paper 2: Ethical Themes Students will take a 1 hour 45 minute examination covering how religion approaches 4 modern world ethical themes.

Revision Lessons and Seminars A program of in school revision sessions and online revision seminars will be available to support examination revision.

Christian Practices Students will study a variety of major Christian practices and their sources of wisdom and authority.

Islamic Practices Students will study a variety of major Islamic practices and their sources of wisdom and authority.

Mock Examination 2 An opportunity for students to test their skills with a full examination paper before their final mock exams.

Mock Examination 1 An opportunity for students to test their skills with an examination paper covering all of the GCSE covered so far.

Examination Practice 1 The first major assessment point covering the GCSE.

YEAR 10

GCSE RELIGIOUS STUDIES: PHILOSOPHY AND ETHICS (AQA A)

Islamic Beliefs Students will study a variety of major Islamic beliefs and their sources of wisdom and authority.

Religion: Peace and Conflict This unit covers philosophical and ethical questions about War, Conflict, Protests and Reconciliation in the modern world.

Religion and Human Relationship This unit covers philosophical and ethical questions about how different religions respond to the variety of family and human relationships in the modern world.

Examination Practice 2 A second major assessment point covering the GCSE so far.

Religion, Crime and Punishment This unit covers philosophical and ethical questions about how different religions respond to crime and different approaches to punishment.

Christian Beliefs Students will study a variety of major Christian beliefs and their sources of wisdom and authority.

The Power of Suffering This unit covers philosophical and ethical responses to the problems caused by suffering in the world.

Is it ever right to kill? This unit covers philosophical and ethical responses to situations such as war and in medical ethics whether 'killing' is always wrong?

YEAR 9

RELIGION AND WORLD ISSUES

Buddhism: Belief and Practices This unit introduces students to the major beliefs and practices in Buddhist traditions.

What happens when we die? This unit covers the variety of beliefs that major religious and scientific traditions have about death and the possibility of an afterlife.

Being a Muslim in Modern Britain This unit covers a range of opportunities and challenges faced by Muslims in the modern United Kingdom.

Judaism: Belief and Practices This unit introduces students to the major beliefs and practices in Jewish traditions.

Beyond the 6: Other worldviews This unit introduces students to the variety of religious beliefs outside of the six largest religious traditions in the United Kingdom.

Hinduism: Belief and Practices This unit introduces students to the major beliefs and practices in Hindu traditions.

Sikhism: Belief and Practices This unit introduces students to the major beliefs and practices in Sikh traditions.

A Holy Place: Jerusalem This unit introduces students to the concept of holy places focussing on the history and tensions surrounding the city of Jerusalem.

Religion and Nature This unit introduces students to the beliefs that major religious groups have about animals and the environment.

Role Models and Religion This unit introduces students to the concept of role models focussing on influential historical figures inspired by their religious beliefs.

Christian: Beliefs and practices This unit introduces students to the major beliefs and practices in Christian traditions.

Key Religious Figures This unit introduces students to the major founders and developers of the six largest modern religious traditions in the United Kingdom.
