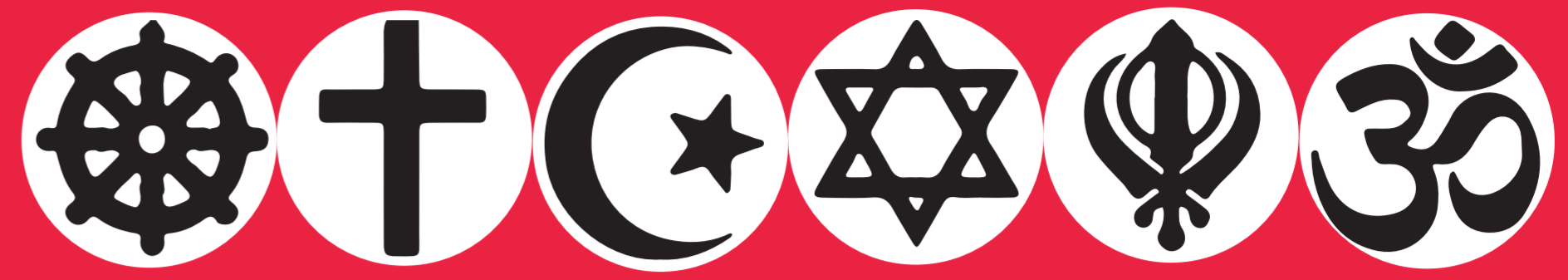

Examination Paper 2: Ethical Themes Students will take a 1 hour 45 minute examination covering how religion approaches 4 modern world ethical themes.

Islamic Beliefs: Students will study a variety of major Islamic beliefs and their sources of wisdom and authority.

Existence of God: This unit covers a variety of beliefs that major religious and philosophical traditions have about the existence of God and the divine.

Relationship and Families: This unit covers philosophical and ethical questions about how different religions respond to the variety of family and human relationships in the modern world.

Christians and Justice: This unit covers a variety of beliefs that major Christian traditions have about justice and its application in the world.

Crime and Punishment: This unit covers philosophical and ethical questions about how different religions respond to crime and different approaches to punishment.

Being a Muslim in Britain: This unit covers a range of opportunities and challenges faced by Muslims in the modern United Kingdom.

Human Rights and Equity: This unit covers a variety of beliefs that major religious and philosophical traditions have about human rights and the concept of equity.

Christian Beliefs: Students will study a variety of major Christian beliefs and their sources of wisdom and authority.

Role Models and Religion: This unit introduces students to the concept of role models focussing on influential historical figures inspired by their religious beliefs.

Sacred Spaces: This unit introduces students to the architecture and use of religious buildings of the six largest modern religious traditions in the United Kingdom
