## 1. Purpose of the Policy

This policy aims to:

- explain **how to apply** for a place at the school
- set out the school's **arrangements for allocating places**
- explain **how to appeal** against a decision not to offer a place

## 2. Policy Detail

### Legislation and Statutory Requirements

As an academy, the school is required by its funding agreement to comply with these codes, and with the law relating to admissions as set out in the [School Standards and Framework Act 1998](#)

### Definitions

The **normal admissions round** is the period during which parents can apply for state-funded school places at the school's normal point of entry, using the common application form provided by their home local authority.

**Looked after children** are children who, at the time of making an application to a school, are:

- in the care of a local authority, or
- being provided with accommodation by a local authority in exercise of its social services functions

**Previously looked after children** are children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they:

- were adopted under the Adoption Act 1976 or the Adoption and Children Act 2002, or
- became subject to a child arrangements order, or
- became subject to a special guardianship order

### Home Address

The home address is considered to be the child's, along with their parent/carer's, main and genuine principal place of residence at the time of the allocation of places, i.e. where they are normally and regularly living.

If a child is resident with friends or relatives (for reasons other than legal guardianship), the friends' or relatives' address will not be considered.

Where parents share responsibility and the child lives with both parents, documentary evidence will be required to confirm the address to be used.

If a place is offered based on an address that is later found to be different from the child's normal residence at the time of allocation, the place may be withdrawn.

A child reaches **compulsory school age** on the prescribed day following his or her fifth birthday (or on his or her fifth birthday if it falls on a prescribed day). The prescribed days are 31 December, 31 March and 31 August.

### **Distance**

On behalf of the academy, the Local Authority uses a Geographical Information System (GIS) to calculate home to school distances in miles.

Distances are calculated using Ordnance Survey (OS) data from the applicant's home address to the main front gate of the school. Coordinates are determined using the Local Land and Property Gazetteer (LLPG) and OS Address Point data.

### **How to apply**

Applications for the normal admissions round must be made using the application form provided by your home local authority.

You will receive an offer of a school place directly from your local authority.

## **Allocation of Places**

1. September - October 2026 - The Academy will provide an opportunity for parents/carers and children to visit the Academy.
2. 31 October 2026 – Common Application Form to be completed by parent/carer and returned to the Staffordshire LA **not** the Academy.
3. Staffordshire LA sends a list of Landau Forte Academy, Amington's applications to the Academy.
4. The applicants are ranked against the admissions policy and over subscription criteria.
5. 1 March 2027 offers of places are made to parents.

## **Admission Number**

The school has an agreed admission number of 192 pupils for entry in Year 7.

## **Oversubscription Criteria**

All children whose statement of special educational needs (SEN) or education, health and care (EHC) plan names the school will be admitted before any other places are allocated.

If the school is not oversubscribed, all applicants will be offered a place.

In the event that the school receives more applications than the number of places it has available, places will be given to those children who meet any of the criteria set out below, in order until all places are filled.

1. Looked after and previously looked after children
2. Children on roll at Landau Forte Academy Greenacres Primary School at the national closing date for applications
3. Children with a sibling attending the school at the time of admission
4. Children who live within the **old** Woodhouse catchment area.

Where it is not possible to accommodate all pupils applying for places within a particular category then places will be allocated in accordance with the remaining criteria.

## **Tie break**

In the case of two or more applications that cannot be separated by the oversubscription criteria outlined above, the school will use the distance between the school and a child's home as a tie breaker to decide between applicants. Priority will be given to children who live closest to the school. Distance will be measured in a straight line from the child's home address to the school's front gates on Woodland Road. A child's home address will be considered to be where he/she is resident for the majority of nights in a normal school week.

## **In-year admissions**

Applications outside the normal admissions round should be made directly to the school.

Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) naming the school will be admitted.

If no places are available, applicants will be placed on a waiting list.

## **Waiting Lists**

Unsuccessful applicants will be placed on a waiting list in accordance with the oversubscription criteria and not based on the date of application.

If places become available, they will be offered to the child at the top of the waiting list.

Waiting lists will be maintained until 31 December 2027.

Inclusion on the waiting list does not guarantee that a place will become available.

A child's position on the waiting list may change as new applications are received and the list is re-ranked.

### **Appeals**

If your child's application for a place at the school is unsuccessful, you will be informed why admission was refused and given information about the process for hearing appeals. If you wish to appeal, you must set out the grounds for your appeal in writing and send it to the Local Authority School Admissions Appeal Team.

The school's appeals timetable for September admission is as follows:

Offer of School Place from Local Authority	1 March (Prior to September Admission)
Parents wishing to Appeal should contact the Local Authority	From 1 March
Deadline for appeals	31 March
Notification of appeal date, time and venue	10 working days prior to appeal hearing
Deadline for evidence supporting the appeal	4 clear working days prior to the appeal date
Outcome of appeal	5 working days of the appeal date

### **Requests for Admission outside the normal age group**

Parents are entitled to request a place for their child outside of their normal age group.

Decisions on requests for admission outside the normal age group will be made on the basis of the circumstances of each case and in the best interests of the child concerned. In accordance with the School Admissions Code, this will include taking account of:

- parents' views
- information about the child's academic, social and emotional development
- where relevant, their medical history and the views of a medical professional
- whether they have previously been educated out of their normal age group
- whether they may naturally have fallen into a lower age group if it were not for being born prematurely
- the Principal's views

Wherever possible, requests for admission outside a child's normal age group will be processed as part of the main admissions round. They will be considered on the basis of the admission arrangements laid out in this policy, including the oversubscription criteria listed in section 6. Applications will not be treated as a lower priority if parents have made a request for a child to be admitted outside the normal age group.

Parents will always be informed of the reasons for any decision on the year group a child should be admitted to. Parents do not have a right to appeal if they are offered a place at the school but it is not in their preferred age group.

### **Monitoring arrangements**

This policy will be reviewed and approved by the Governing Body every year.

Whenever changes to admission arrangements are proposed (except where the change is an increase to the agreed admission number), the governing board will publicly consult on these changes.

### **Compliance Statement**

This admissions policy complies with the School Admissions Code and the School Admission Appeals Code.
